Power of Laws

 Adherence depends on moral force behind laws

 Without compliance, laws serve no purpose

Conflict View

Everyone agrees what is harmful behavior

Who Creates Laws?


- Politicians?

What is the Definition of Laws?

Legislate behavior and set rules for society





Legal Paternalism



- Against: Person makes own decisions as long as it doesn't negatively impact others.
- For: Person is a valued member of society and society is compelled to protect.

Do lawmakers have a responsibility to create laws that promote social morality?



Legal Moralism

- Laws act as moral agents
 - Sexual behavior between consenting adults harms who?
 - Pornography harms who?
 - Homosexual marriages harm who?
- Interesting conflicts
 - Hate speech OK but crimes with hate are not
 - Gambling OK in casino but not done privately

Can laws be immoral?



"An unjust law is any that degrades human personality or compels a minority to obey something the majority does not adhere to or is a law the minority had no part in making."


What are Sundown laws?

Blacks must be inside before the sun went down. Not allowed out after dark.



Reasons for Laws

- Harm Principle
 - Prevent harm to others
- Offense Principle
 - Prevent crimes
- Legal Paternalism
 - Prevent people from harming self
- Legal Moralism
 - Prohibit immorality/standards
- Benefit to Others
 - Deterrence



New Law: "Foolish Motorists Liable"

- New Legislation 2006
 - Insurers may refuse to reimburse policyholders if:
 - Keys left in vehicle
 - Items stolen in unlocked car

1 in 5 stolen vehicles was unlocked at the time of theft!

- "He's 22, She's 14. Should they be allowed to marry?
 - Legally wed in Kansas, Matthew and Crystal had a baby. They call it love.
 Nebraska, their home state, calls it rape.
 - Matthew charged in Nebraska with first degree sexual assault and faces 50 years in prison.

Problem With Laws: Double Standards Exist

- Can't hit mother but can financially abandon her
- Can't neglect/abuse child but don't have to nurture
- Can't beat partner but can emotional

abuse



Problem With Laws: Comply With Law But Not Spirit

Attorney Story

Attorney Story.....

"A very wealthy man is dying. He asks his three best friends —a priest, an accountant and an attorney to come visit. On his death bed, he says to his friends, 'I've spent my entire life making money and accumulating wealth. I've decided I want to take some of my wealth with me and I want you to help me. I'm going to give each of you an envelope with \$20,000 dollars in it and I want you to put the envelope in my coffin, at the viewing, so I can be buried with my money.' Well, the three men think it's an unusual request, but they agree to do it.

The wealthy man passes away and at the viewing, the priest, accountant and lawyer each drop an envelope in the coffin. As they are walking out of the funeral home, the priest says, 'I've got a confession to make. I took \$5,000 out of my envelope to give to the poor. There are so many hungry people in my parish, I just couldn't see burying \$20,000 when the money could be used to feed and clothe the poor.' The accountant said, 'I'm glad to hear you say that because I took \$10,000 out of my envelope. I did a lot of accounting work for our friend before he died. He hasn't paid me and I figured he owes me \$10,000 for my services.' The attorney looks at the two men and says, 'I'm appalled! How could you do that? We each make a solemn promise to put \$20,000 in his coffin. I just want you to know that I wrote him a check for the full \$20,000!"

Arizona – Comply but not with Spirit

Example: 9 month pregnant women drives HOV lane and gets ticket.

"Whether my son is in a car seat versus in my stomach, I don't get it."

2006 Ruling: Judge requires woman to pay fine

Problem With Laws: Few Dictate Good Behavior

- Don't have to report crime.
- Don't have to assist others.
- Don't have to pay bills (Exception: child support).
- Don't have to volunteer or give to charity.



Problem With Laws: Criminal Vs. Moral Culpability

- Mitigate crime/punishment based on intent.
- Excuse crimes based on mental state (juveniles and mentally ill).
- Excuse crime based on influence (abuse).
- Not guilty of crime but morally culpable.



Colorado Cas Two 16 year olds

Example: Colorado Case

Joe and Ashley, both 16 years old leave a friend's house late at night. It is a rural area and no alcohol consumption is involved. Ashley is driving the vehicle, turns too sharp on a curve and rolls the truck. Joe, the passenger, gets out of the truck, walks home and goes to bed. (He does not call the police or attempt to help Ashley.) Ashley, seriously injured lays unconscious for six hours. She is found the next day after her parent's call police and report her missing. She was hospitalized for three weeks before she died from her injuries.

*Result: There was no crime to charge Joe with. His behavior was not illegal, but was it morally wrong?

Problem With Laws: Consequence Based



Assumes deterrence works

- Citizens disregard consequences
- Few actually face consequences
 - 50% crime goes unreported

Summary of Laws Purpose

Formalism

- Actions always wrong if illegal
- Enforce all laws---eliminate discretion

Utilitarianism

- Punishment greater than benefit of crime
- Consequences must generate results (deterrence)

Virtue Ethics

Judge based on motives/intent and situation

Laws NOT Only Solution

- Are we "law happy?"
 - How many laws were created in 2006?

Controlling Behavior: Code Of Ethics

 <u>Definition</u>: Professional rules which encourage members to perform under ideal behaviors; <u>motivator</u>

• Problems:

- Won't eliminate wrongdoing
- Focus on behavior not values
- Rules replace ethical standards

Educate and reinforce ethical decision making
